

ECB Scorer Pathway:

S2 Representative Game Scorer - Professional Skills, Knowledge and Competencies



Planning & Preparation (up to and arriving at the game)

- Has obtained ECB Scoring Authorisation prior to match day
- Knows the difference between electronic scoring systems

Scoring Technique & Scorebox Etiquette

- Has advanced competence in Play-Cricket Scorer Pro system
- Works with Analyst (if present) to ensure that errors and differences in scores are corrected before closing the match
- Adheres to Best Practice guide when scoring in the NV Play database
- Is aware of what data should be recorded, e.g. Analysts and wagon wheels
- Can accurately manage the following scenarios in the following contexts:
 - Match points
 - Interruption timings / state of play
 - Last hour of play
 - Recording fielding positions for wickets
 - Multi-Fielder run outs as per ECB Protocol
 - Intervals that affect timings
 - Multi day over rates
 - Follow on
 - New ball taken
 - End of day in PCS Pro

People & Match Management.

- Demonstrates thorough knowledge and application of all Laws, Rules & Regulations applicable to the match
- Consistent in all aspect of scoring work
- Anticipates umpire interactions and requests for information
- Checks at appropriate times and anticipates extra checks before landmarks
- Is aware of upcoming milestones and checks with colleagues before they occur
- Is aware of the restrictions on scorers in televised matches and has contingency plans to ensure that relevant information is both given and received
- Advanced DLS knowledge including protocols

Teamwork.

- Has an awareness of how to work with an analyst
- Understands differences between working with umpires in professional settings compared to recreational settings
