

# ECB Scorer Pathway:

## S3 Representative Game Scorer - Recreational Skills, Knowledge and Competencies



### Planning & Preparation (up to and arriving at the game).

- Has an established routine to plan and prepare for a forthcoming match
- Talks to appropriate match and ground officials as part of their pre-match routine
- Identifies and pursues learning and development opportunities
- Accepts appointments in a timely and professional manner
- Have identified the appropriate scoring method for the match and can adapt accordingly

### Scoring Technique & Scorebox Etiquette.

- Clear, consistent, accurate, legible and timely recording of events using appropriate/required scoring method (book and/or electronically)
- Fully aware of scoring position and gives consideration to their colleague
- Confident, remains calm in their recording of game events
- Demonstrates thorough knowledge of MCC Laws of Cricket plus competition rules and regulations applicable to scorers
- Understand the impact of the following scenarios and recording appropriate:
  - Run out of non-striker without delivering the ball
  - Substitutes (including concussion substitutes as per competition regulations)
  - Dead Ball (how to record, does it count as delivery in over)
- Can record basic stats including strike rates, economy rates, averages and partnerships
- Can accurately manage the following scenarios in the following contexts:
  - Match points
  - Interruption timings / state of play
  - Last hour of play
  - Intervals that affect timings
  - Multi-day over rates
  - Follow on
  - New ball taken
  - End of day in Play-Cricket Scorer

### People & Match Management.

- Has appropriate levels of intervention with fellow officials
- Builds effective relationships with players, coaches and spectators through a consistent approach
- Can problem solve issues in a timely manner whilst continuing to score
- Can record appropriately in a cancelled/abandoned match
- Is aware of the ECB social media use policy

### Teamwork.

- Knows procedures well and can explain to players, coaches and spectators
- Applies their skills, knowledge and competence to minimise errors and possible incidents
- Demonstrates effective teamwork with colleagues
- Can communicate effectively
- Receptive and responds well to feedback
- Correctness of scores (who is responsible/when can the score be amended)
