

ECB Scorer Pathway: S5 Team Scorer

Skills, Knowledge and Competencies



Planning & Preparation (up to and arriving at the game).

- Has an understanding of a pre-match routine and what it contains
- Is aware of what equipment is required to complete the role
- Arrives in a timely manner prior to the start of the game
- Is aware of what needs to happen to set up and be prepared for the game
- Has an awareness of competition regulations

Scoring Technique & Scorebox Etiquette.

- Ensures required information is provided from key stakeholders, e.g. named players, who won the toss, etc.
- Understands the need for scoring routines (scoring sequence, how to watch the match)
- Records events on the field of play factually, e.g. short & long overs
- Can use electronic scoring as relevant to the game
- Can complete a standard paper scoring record accurately
- Knows the regulations for a batter retiring and how to record
- Can identify and record the score as per Law 3 of MCC Laws of cricket and differences between symbols used in paper and electronic scoring
- Can identify and record Maidens and Wicket Maidens factually
- Can understand the different types of extras and can record consistently
- Can identify the different dismissals and record how out appropriately (scoresheet entries include fall of wicket and fielders' names)
- Can recognise basic umpire signals
- Can identify when runs are scored
- Has an awareness of the impact of short runs and overthrows

People & Match Management.

- Conduct themselves in an appropriate manner with key stakeholders
- Can recognise errors in recording and seeks additional knowledge when required
- Is aware of the ECB General Conduct Regulations (GCR)

Teamwork.

- Understands the end of over procedure (checking, bowling totals, score at end of over)
- Appropriately acknowledges umpire signals
